Church Council Highlights: Letters of thanks were received from the Greater Moncton Music Festival, the West End Food Bank and the M&S Fund of the UCC. COMMITTEE REPORTS: CHURCH FINANCES It was noted that local envelope offerings are up for March and up for YTD. Other offerings are down due to less fundraisers this year. Expenses are down due mostly to lower fuel costs. A motion to make a \$1,000 contribution to the West End Food Bank was made. **PROPERTY MAINTENANCE** upcoming work around the church will include: shelves will be put up in the Memorial Room, the burner on the stove will be repaired before the pancake breakfast, the fount will be placed on casters, there will be improvements to the nursery, the floor tile in the staff bathroom will be looked at and possibly new flooring will be installed in the sanctuary. WORSHIP COMMITTEE The special services coming up are: May 3 - Anniversary Sunday and dedication of the Communion Ware, May 10 - Mother's Day the CGIT are conducting the service, the Rev Jane Aikman will conduct the service on the 17th and Beverly would be willing to write the service and have lay persons in the congregation conduct the service on May 31st (while she is at Conference). June 7th is the 90th Anniversary of the United Church of Canada. The BLAST closing service at Camper's City will be on June 14th and the Father's Day, Graduate Service will be June 21. Marlene MacLeod and Sandra Foreman-Webb will both be attending Conference on our behalf this year. MEN'S GROUP/FINANCE/FUNDRAISING Jim Morris reported that grocery cards have been going better since the machine for Debit/Credit was installed.
